Building a community of election practitioners

The ACE Electoral Knowledge Network aims to bring together, from around the world, election practitioners—including electoral management bodies, political parties, journalists and others—to share information, advice and resources. This community will be built through the creation of Regional Resource Centres, an Experts' Database and an "Ask-a-Question" Function.



The ACE partners are currently working to set up Regional Resource Centres across the globe. These centres will collect comparative data and resource materials, field questions that are relevant to

the region, produce case studies and other useful resources, and work to build the capacity development of regional election practitioners. • Capacity development: building the profession of electoral management
