Paper: Standards for External and Absentee Voting

Four Basic Questions:

- Is the provision of franchise to citizens abroad a “right” protected by international law?
- Who should be eligible to vote from outside of their home districts?
 - Forced migrants
 - Expatriate and migrant laborers
 - Non-citizens claiming linkage
- What sorts of systems of representation should be established for these voters?
- How can the secrecy of the ballot and election transparency be protected and costs contained?
