<p>Proper identification documents may include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> One identification document showing the name, address and signature of the applicant, such as a driver's license <p>OR</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Two identification documents, one showing the name and signature, i.e., old age security card, credit card, passport, citizenship card, and one showing their name and address of residence, i.e., a tax or utility bill.
