

As part of the UNDP programme to promote democratic governance, the Electoral Support Project (ESP) is dedicated to strengthening electoral system and processes in Nepal.






Central Data Centre established to store voter registration information at ECN; disaster recovery site established at the Government Integrated Data Centre in the Singha Durbar.



ECN successfully published the new voters roll with photographs and used it in the 2013 CA elections and 2017 local, provincial and federal level elections.


5. Support with Procedures and Training



ECN and election officials and election stakeholders trained on electoral procedures, security management, administration and logistics, election observation and election reporting.

6. Support with Election Operations and Logistics

- Supported in Guidelines on electoral operation during COVID 19 pandemic.
- 485 tons of paper procured for the 2013 ballot papers.
- · Purchased 2 units of high-speed heavy duty color printers for ECN to produce voter roll and voter ID card as well as one unit of air compressor table hydraulic paper cutting machine (1 set and Ballot Paper Numbering System - 4 sets with accessories) for the Janak Educational Materials Centre to allow for the timely production of ballot papers.
- 6 SUVs, 5 pickup and 25 motorcycles procured for the ECN in 2014.
- · Assembly area for polling station kits at the ECN premises established which is currently being used as storage facility.
- In 2020, prepared an outline of key content for the operational plan for the 2022/23 elections.
- Procured a Mediatoolkit for social media monitoring group in the local level election 2022.
- Procurement Zoom license to the ECN for virtual meetings following COVID-19 pandemic.



















7. Support with Electoral Dispute Resolution

Adopted a standard operating procedure on EDR,

553 (72 Females) election officials, the judiciary and other stakeholders

participated in capacity-building training on electoral dispute resolution, conducted together with the National Judicial Academy.

Produced Nepal's first resource book on electoral justice that was launched by the President of Nepal in 2020.



29 cases of disputes

including two cases filed in the Returning Officer's office in 52 by-elections, November 2019

8. Support with Electoral Security



- Conducted assesment on Electoral Violence Mitigation Strategy 2012.
- Established the Joint Election Operation Centre in the ECN headquarter.
- Worked with UNDP's Social Cohesion and Democratic Participation to organise campaigns to promote a conducive environment for inclusive and credible elections.
- Prepared 4 digital posters to prevent GBV/VAW in elections and shared on social media platforms targeting the Local Level Election 2022.




- Collaborated with UNESCO to work with the Ministry of Education's 298 Community

10. Support with Establishment of Electoral Education and Information Centres (EEIC)



- Constructed the EEIC building, as well as provided the necessary equipment for the place. The **Election Education and Information Centre (EEIC)** is an interactive venue that provides information on electoral procedures, the constitution, democracy, political parties and political processes.
- Supported the establishment of additional EEICs at the regional and later provincial level in Pokhara (in 2015), Dhangadi (in 2015), Biratnagar (in 2019), and Surkhet (in 2019).
- Mobile EEICs were introduced for remote locations.
- 30,444 people already visited the EEICs.









11. Support with External Relations

- Constructed the Media Centre; Call Centre, Observers Resource Centre and Warehouse at ECN HQ.
- Supported media monitoring of the 2013 election through Nepal Press Institute.



- Collaborated with ECN, UNESCO, Federation of Nepali Journalists and other development partners to mark the WORLD PRESS FREEDOM DAY event: a one-page infographic is available here.
- 565 People (312 Female, 1 Other) from Civil Society, Political Party, and Electoral Stakeholders participated in interactions on electoral process and issues.
- Established a mechanism to enhance election-related activities all the way to the grassroot level, through the appointment of Electoral Focal Persons at all 753 local level and 7 provincial level governments.
- A Master Training of Trainers for the Electoral Focal Persons included 23 participants and 12 facilitators, acquainting them with the workings of the Commission.
- Conducted 14 province level public hearings/dialogs events in seven provinces in collaboration with the UNWOMEN and reached to 700 people from political party and local leaders, media and CSOs. Programmes were conducted before the Local level elections to sensitize people on the issues of inclusion in elections.

12. Support with Gender, Social Inclusion and Vulnerable Groups



Launched its first Gender and Social Inclusion Policy in 2013, as well as an updated Gender and Inclusion Policy in Electoral Management in 2021.



Developed Election Commission's first Social Media Policy.
