Introduction

In order to ensure credible, transparent elections, it is vitally necessary that all voters and stakeholders are well informed about the importance of elections in strengthening democracy. The Electoral Education and Information Center (hereinafter referred to as the "Center") was established in 2011 with the objectives of enhancing awareness and participation of voters towards electoral systems, processes and procedures by making electoral education more accountable, transparent and accessible to voters.

The Center is located within the premises of the Election Commission at Kantipath in Kathmandu. Through this Center, the Election Commission of Nepal aims to provide civic and democratic electoral education to visiting individuals and groups, encouraging people of all remote areas and under privileged class, race, sex and regions through a number of outreach programs.

Facilities

The activities to be accomplished by, and the facilities to be available at the Center will be as follows:

- 1. Information and Education Center:** It includes the following:
 - **Exhibition Hall/ Museum-** Exhibition of election related materials of historical and archaeological importance from within the country and abroad.
 - **Mini Theatre-** Multimedia presentations to disseminate information about democracy and elections.
 - **Interactive Zone-** Interactive sessions on various issues such as democracy, constitutional and electoral history, citizens' rights and duties, electoral systems and voting processes, political parties and political processes, roles and responsibilities of stakeholders in elections, etc.
 - **Polling Center/Booth-** Mock polling exercises that give glimpses of electoral systems, processes and procedures.
- 2. Library:** A modern information technology library specifically meant for researchers and scholars, containing various books, journals and newsletters as well as articles and papers relating to evolution of democracy and championing of elections in Nepal and elsewhere.
- 3. Training Center:** Regular training programs on electoral matters conducted by the Election Commission. In addition, national, regional and international BRIDGE (Building Resources in Democracy, Governance and Elections) training programs will also be held. During elections, this Center will also serve as the media center and information clearing house.



Program Overview

The visitors will receive:

- Electoral education on the evolution of democratic governance in Nepal, history of elections, electoral systems, processes and procedures in a fun and interactive;
- Information in a simple and entertaining way about democracy and elections as well as constitution, government, voters' rights and duties in the Interactive Zone;
- An opportunity to participate in electoral activities through mock polling exercise. All the visitors will participate in the electoral process and experience first hand information on the voting process;
- An encouraging environment for teaching and learning.
