

# **OBSERVER'S CHECKLIST**

For the elections of deputies to the Majlisi Namoyandagon of the Majlisi Oli of the Republic of Tajikistan and to local Majlises













Republic of Tajikistan Dushanbe, 2005 The main task for the representatives of political parties and candidates on Election Day is to observe the voting process and the vote counting procedure. Election observation requires discretion, common sense, foresight, and good judgment. Only those who possess such qualities can be appointed to the post of election observer.

Observers at the polling stations are representatives of their political parties or candidates. Their actions, positive or negative, directly reflect on the party or candidate.

Congratulations! You have been appointed representative of your political party or candidate. You will act as an election observer on Election Day at your assigned polling stations on February \_\_\_\_\_, 2005. You will play an extremely important role in ensuring that the elections are truly free and fair and express the will of the people of Tajikistan.

In this booklet, there are no detailed explanations of the Constitutional Law of the Republic of Tajikistan "On the Elections of the Majlisi Oli of the Republic of Tajikistan", which concerns the electoral process. However, each representative must know and be able to apply the articles and regulations of this law.

In this booklet, there are excerpts from the laws on elections and from the regulations on the participation of political parties in elections in the Republic of Tajikistan. This booklet is to be used as a workbook for election observers.

### Who are these representatives of political parties and candidates who act as election observers?

These people are citizens who give their time and effort to the party or candidate on whose behalf they are working. They may be a member of the party or a supporter of the party or candidate. Their task is to be present at the polling station on Election Day from the beginning of the voting until the official document on the voting results is written and a copy of protocol on voting results posted in the polling premises.

The representative of the political party or candidate acts as both a witness and a monitor. He or she is a witness of the events that occur on Election Day at the polling station to which he/she is assigned. He or she is also a monitor of the elections to ensure that the citizens of the Republic of Tajikistan, the members of Precinct Election Commission, the political parties, and candidates can enjoy the rights granted to them and the responsibilities prescribed to them by the Constitution of the Republic of Tajikistan and the constitutional laws of the Republic of Tajikistan entitled "On the Elections of the Majlisi Oli of the Republic of Tajikistan" and "On the Elections of the Deputies of Local Majlises".

As a witness, the observer will register the happenings of the Election Day by taking notes and filling in the checklist. As a monitor, the observer will ask, with the permission of the Commission Chairman the necessary questions and express concerns that may lead to correct possible or potential violations without interfering in the process.

#### Why is election observation required?

The participation of representatives of political parties and candidates and international observers in the elections is very important for the entire voting process. Their presence at the polling stations on Election Day, in all regions of Tajikistan, serves several purposes:

- To strengthen the public trust in elections, which simultaneously increases citizens' political participation in the election process;
- To create a free and open atmosphere during the elections;
- To discourage forgery or fraud during the voting and the vote counting processes;

- To expose any fraudulent activities and willful violations and to take measures for their prevention;
- To reduce opportunities for frivolous or unfounded allegations of impropriety;
- To provide information which lawmakers and election commissions can use to assess the election process and to make any necessary improvements.

### The Rights and Responsibilities of Observers

### 1. Rights

Your right to participate in the voting process as a representative of a party or candidate is guaranteed by Article 8 of the Constitutional Law of the Republic of Tajikistan "On the Elections of the Majlisi Oli of the Republic of Tajikistan". It states: "Political parties that have nominated candidates and independent candidates have the right to appoint national observers who will observe the election at the polling station on Election Day."

### National observers enjoy the right:

- To be familiarized with the voter lists;
- To be present at the meetings of the election commissions;
- To be present in the voting premises from the moment the district election commission starts its work until the moment it finishes;
- To observe the distribution of ballots to voters;
- To observe the process of canceling unused and invalid ballots, and to observe the vote counting process;
- To familiarize with the protocols of the Precinct Election Commission on the voting results.
- To ask questions, with the permission of the chairman of the corresponding election commission, receive answers and draw attention of the commission members and those present to any cases of violations of the law;
- To appeal the decision and actions (or inactions) of the election commission to a higher-level election commission or to the courts;
- To be present at the re-counting of the votes at the corresponding election commission, if this occurs.

### The national observers do not have the right:

- To distribute ballots to voters:
- To sign the list, at the request of voters, stating that the voter received a ballot;
- To mark a ballot at the request of a voter;
- To do any action that compromises the confidentiality of the votes;
- To be present in the voting booth during the voting process;
- To participate in the vote counting that is conducted by the election commission;
- To do any action that impedes the work of the election commission or to participate in the decision-making processes of the corresponding election commission.

#### You also may:

- Attach to your report your evaluation, impressions, and any other documents you deem necessary.
- Meet with other representatives and observers if necessary.

• Temporarily leave the voting premises when necessary.

### 2. Responsibilities

- Study the laws on elections and the regulations of the Central Commission on Elections and Referenda.
- Familiarize yourself with the polling station where you will carry out your observations.
- Familiarize yourself with the list of parties and candidates.
- Introduce yourself to all members of the election commission.
- During the voting and vote counting processes, conduct yourself professionally. Avoid any actions interfering with the required processes for voting and conducting the vote count. Note the approximate time and location of any violations and provide as much evidence as possible.
- Ask questions, write notes, express your concerns do not give instructions, and do not show your favoritism with any decision made by the election commission.

The intervention of party representatives and observers in the voting process and in the activity of the election commissions is prohibited. Observers have right to ask questions and request answers only with the permission of the chairman of the precinct election commission. They may also draw the attention of polling station workers and others present to the cases in which the law is being violated.

- You should represent your party or candidate.
- You must arrive 30 minutes prior to the opening of the polling station and not leave until all ballots are counted and all protocols are issued.
- You must send your observation report (see attachment) to your party or candidate.

### **Instructions and Reporting Forms**

To function effectively as an election observer, follow the instructions below and fill in the attached forms.

### I. Before Election Day

- Learn the election laws thoroughly.
- Make sure that the voter list at the polling station is publicly displayed 15 days prior to the elections so that voters can see it.
- OBTAIN THE NECESSARY DOCUMENTS TO BE ACREDITED AS AN OBSERVER FROM YOUR PARTY OR CANDIDATE.
- Introduce yourself to the members of precinct election commission.

The republican or local bodies of political parties shall present their applications with the enclosed lists of their representatives to the district electoral commissions not later than 10 days prior to the day of the elections. The district electoral commissions will then inform the precinct electoral commissions no later than 5 days prior to the election day. The surname, name, and patronymic of the representative (observer) and the location of his or her residence should be indicated in the lists as well as the exact polling stations in which he or she intends to exercise his representation. The political party and candidates to deputies must give its representative (observer) a document identifying his or her authority.

### II. Preparations for Election Day

To be an effective observer at the polling station, you will need to prepare and bring the following materials with you:

- 1. A certificate issued by your political party or candidate containing your full name, residence, the number and name of the assigned polling station, where you will conduct your observations.
- 2. A passport, identification card, or other identification document.
- 3. Observer's Manual and Observer's Checklist.
- 4. Paper and pencil
- 5. If possible, you may want to take with you the following:
  - A watch.
  - A camera.
  - A flashlight.
  - Food and water.
  - A calculator.

You must arrive at **5:30 a.m.**, 30 minutes before the opening of the polling station, in order to observe the preparations for opening the station. Be sure you have organized your transportation before the Election Day.

After you complete your report, deliver it immediately to the agreed upon place. Remember, your work as an election observer will have no effect if the party or candidate you are representing has no written report on the results of your observations.

#### SAMPLE ACTS ON VIOLATIONS OF THE ELECTION LAW:

Observer must write a statement on each election law violation he or she witnessed and obtain the signatures of other observers and proxies who were also witnesses. The statements are sent to the district election commission. One copy is given to the observer's political party headquarters or to the candidate. If necessary, the complaint can be sent to the court. The chairman of election commission must be informed of each statement you write and be given a copy.
