Enrolment and voting

Can you enrol to vote if you are living on Norfolk Island?

You are entitled to enrol as a Norfolk Island elector for federal elections if you live on Norfolk Island, and:

- are an Australian citizen, or a British subject who was enrolled on 25 January 1984; and
- are 18 years or older; and
- have lived at your address for at least one month.

You may enrol when you are 17, but you cannot vote until you are 18.

NOTE: If your nominated address is in Tasmania or the Northern Territory, you are entitled to vote in their state/territory elections. There is no provision to vote at any of the other state elections or the ACT Legislative Assembly elections.

Do you have to enrol and vote?

Enrolment for the purpose of federal elections by Australian citizens resident on Norfolk Island is not compulsory. However, if you are enrolled, you must vote and you may be fined if you don't.

Even though you may enrol at 17, you cannot vote until you are 18 years of age.

In which division (federal electorate) can you enrol?

If you are a Norfolk Island resident you may claim enrolment for an electoral division in a state:

- for which you were last entitled to be enrolled
- for which one of your next of kin is currently enrolled; or
- in which you were born if neither of the above apply; or
- for which you have the closest connection, if you were not born in a state, then the division in the state with which you have the closest connection; or

If none of the above apply, you may claim enrolment for the Division of Canberra in the Australian Capital Territory or the Division of Solomon in the Northern Territory.

Change of residence on Norfolk Island

If you change your address on Norfolk Island you must advise your Divisional Returning Officer.

Who has access to your enrolment information

The general public

The electoral roll can be inspected at any Australian Electoral Commission office or the office of a state electoral authority. Only names and addresses are provided on the publicly available roll.

The Commonwealth of Australia

Electoral information may be disclosed to persons or organisation as listed in the *Commonwealth Electoral Act 1918*. These persons or organisations may include –

- Members of Parliament, Senators, registered political parties, and candidates for House of Representatives elections.
- Electoral authorities of states and territories that have a joint roll arrangement with the Commonwealth.
- Approved medical research and public health screening programs.
- Agencies, persons or organisations prescribed in the Electoral and Referendum Regulations 1940, including certain Australian government agencies and particular bodies for identity verification purposes under Commonwealth legislation relating to financial tracing and anti-money laundering.

Proof of identity

You must prove your identity for electoral enrolment

How do you prove your identity?

- A** If you have an **Australian driver's licence** provide the details at Question 9 on PAGE A2.
You will only need to complete and return PAGE A1 and PAGE A2
- B** If you don't have an Australian driver's licence **show an authorised person a proof of identity document** (see PAGE B for details).
You will need to complete and return PAGE A1, PAGE A2 and PAGE B
- OR
- C** If you don't have an Australian driver's licence AND you don't have any proof of identity documents you need **TWO people who are enrolled and have known you for at least one month to confirm your identity** (see PAGE C for details).
You will need to complete and return PAGE A1, PAGE A2 and PAGE C
