SPECIAL HELP

People who are unable to read or write, or who arc unable to complete thr ballot paper(s) because Of poor rycsight or other disability, may ask someone for help. The witness may help if nobody else is available.

TO THE WITNESS

If your name is on thr Commonwealth of Australia electoral roll. you can be a witness for an elector making a postal vote.

However, when **making a vote overseas, you** can also he a witness if you arc:

- an Australian citizen, or
- an officer of the Australian armed forces, or ofthr armed forces of some other part of the Queen's dominions, or
- an Australian public servant, or a public servant of some other part of the Queen's dominions, or
- a Justice ofthr Peace for, or a Minister of religion or a medical practitioner who lives in, a Territory of the Commonwealth of Australia or some other part of the Queen's dominions.

Note: Spouses qualified to be witnesses may witness each other's signature.

If other people are present when thr voter is filling in the ballot paper(s), you must ensure that they do not communicate with the voter about the vote or assist in any way. However, assistance may be given to a voter who, becauses of a disability, would be unable to complete the ballot paper(s).

POLITICAL CANDIDATES

If you are a candidate standing for election, you cannot be a witness for postal voting at that election.

Please ensure you and your witness have read all of these directions before you vote.

If you wish to keep personal details on this certificate private, simply seal this flap over the details.

BEFORE YOU VOTE

- show your **unmarked** ballot paper(s) and certificate envelope to the witness
- complete and sign the envelope in the presence of the witness
- ask the witness to sign and date the envelope and indicate, in the box entitled "Title of authorised witness", the capacity in which the witness acts, e.g. "elector"

VOTING

Fill in your ballot paper(s). This must be done in the presenceofthe witness but in a way that does not allow the witness to see hon you vote.

VOTING FOR THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

- put number | beside the candidate of your first choice
- put number 2 beside the candidate of your second choice
- put number 3 beside the candidate of your third choice, **and so on.**

You must put a number in every square.

VOTING FOR THE SENATE

You can either vote in the **TOP** section **OR** in the BOTTOM section.

If you vote in the TOP section

• put the number 1 in the box beside the party or group of your choice. That's all you have to do.

If you vote in the BOTTOM section

- put number | beside the candidate of your first choice
- put number 2 beside the candidate of your second choice
- put number 3 beside the candidate of your third choice, **and so on.**
- You must put a number in every square below the thick black line.
