### Filming of polling station lay-out

## TO VOTE IS SIMPLE

### VIDEO

Show diagram of polling station

Mail box with poll card  
show poll card being opened, and  
zero in on address of polling station

Storing poll card

Finding empty mail box

On the phone

Show hot line numbers

Checking list outside the polling  
station

3 or more polling stations on site  
Information Officer with list

Show officers inside the polling  
station

Green line [valid ID card]

### AUDIO

To vote is simple

The Elections & Boundaries Commission  
advises that before election day, you will  
receive a poll card in the mail. Open it to  
find the address of your polling station.

Keep poll card safely and take it with you to  
the polling station on election day

If you did not receive your poll card, one  
would be prepared for you at the polling  
station

However, you should call the Election &  
Boundaries Commission's hot lines  
to find out the location of your polling  
station

On election day you should check the list  
posted outside the polling station for your  
name and consecutive number

Where there are several polling stations  
at the same site, an Information Officer will  
direct you to the correct polling station

If your name is on the list and you have a  
valid ID card, you should join the Green  
Express line

Red Line

All other persons including disabled person should join the Red line

Voter at Poll Clerk's desk

You are required to sign your poll card in front of the Poll Clerk

Voter moving to the Deputy Presiding Officer's desk where the fingers are examined  
ballot paper is folded, then unfolded

The Deputy Presiding Officer examines your fingers and if there is no evidence of electoral ink stains, issues a ballot paper after describing how it should be folded

Voter goes to voting booth to mark the ballot paper

In the privacy of the voting booth, you vote by placing an "X" to the right of your candidate's name and symbol [if you make a mark other than an "X" your ballot would be rejected]

Voter folding the ballot paper

Fold your ballot paper as directed, and proceed to the Ballot Box Poll Clerk

Voter at Ballot Box Poll Clerk's desk displaying the folded ballot paper showing the initials of the Deputy Presiding Officer

At the Ballot Box Poll Clerk, display your folded ballot paper with the initials at the back visible.

Voter dipping finger in electoral ink and inserting the ballot paper in the ballot box

You would be required to dip your fingers in the electoral ink before you are allowed to place the ballot in the ballot box
